The current crisis surrounding the COVID-19 virus has affected all of us in some way. We will continue to follow the advice from the Department of Human Services and the Education Department and support our students throughout the year. # Tyra Henham - Basketball




# **Year 10 Work Experience**

# VCAL: Structured Workplace Learning and VET in Schools (VETis) programs

VCAL Structured Workplace Learning is currently suspended. VCAL students going out on Work Placement during the school term are not required to do this in the current climate. Students should not cancel their placements as we are hoping this will be able to resume at some stage this Semester. More updates will be provided early next term.

The TAFE Institutions we use for offsite VETis programs (VU, Kangan, AIE and William Angliss) all cancelled their face-to-face classes in the last week or two of Term 1. There will be announcements next Term as to whether they will resume classes face to face, or move towards online learning. This can be difficult for certain courses such as trades, but it may be that the bulk of the theory work can be completed in Semester 1 and practical tasks can be completed in Semester 2.

Updates will be provided when new information comes to hand. I would like to begin this letter thanking you all for your support of learning this Term. The complex issue of Coronavirus, some staffing changes and the ongoing building work at the Campus, presents challenges every day. However, the students have admirably embraced every situation, focussed on their learning and had, what I believe to be, the best term at the Campus since my arrival. The Satisfactory Completion Policy and the continuation of the progress reports has ensured we are working together to challenge all learners to be the best they can be.

I remind you again to take note of each progress report. Again this year we will be asking all students with a GPA below 2.5 to attend Homework Club every Tuesday, until their GPA is maintained at 3 or more.

Homework Club is also open every Tuesday to any student who would like to use the space and be supported by teachers. It will be staffed by an English teacher and a Maths and Science tutor. Compass permission is required for each week. I have included the rubric again for you to continue discussions with your child.

The College is embarking on a comprehensive program of independent reading and reading conferences.

Your child will be reading and conferencing with a teacher about their reading during focus group on Tuesday and Wednesday each week. The Principals Reading Challenge has also been launched and the library staff are ensuring there is a wide range of good quality literature available to borrow. Ask your child about their reading and take a look at their conference journals (a yellow booklet). Below are the expectations of each students.

#### **Student expectations:**

- To read during two focus groups per week
- To read during English classes when directed
- 30 minutes reading most nights as part of home learning
- Minimum goal of 3 books per Term
- Books should take no longer than 4 weeks to read
- Books should be divided into sections and reading goals set for each reading session
- Reading journal should be updated weekly
- Reading goals need to be set around:
  - pages read
  - future reading where students are selecting varied books and gradually challenging themselves
  - selecting interesting vocabulary- this can be unfamiliar words, interesting words, words that could enhance writing and speaking








## **Year 7 Horticulture**
