Please note: Your 2019 timetable will be similar as your Orientation Program timetable. The teachers taking your Orientation classes will be your 2019 teachers.







Compulsory Physical and Sport Education

Excursions and Special Occasions

The degree to which students will be expected to wear school uniform will depend on the nature of the occasion and the activities involved. Staff will determine the requirements in consultation with the Campus Principal and parents will be informed. It is the expectation the wearing of full school uniform will be the norm.

Attendance Policy

Policy

Students must attend a minimum of 90% of scheduled class time for each unit. Students who do not attend at least 90% of the classes for a Unit will receive an N for that Unit.

Illness – parent/guardian contact required. (Via phone/email/written note)

Class time needs to be redeemed on return to School.

Medical certificates are required for missed School days. Medical Certificates must be issued by the doctor on the first day of the absence and back dated medical certificates will not be accepted unless extenuating circumstances. The medical certificate does not approve the absence, but allows the student to complete missed work upon returning to school. Ongoing medical issues are required to be communicated to the Level Coordinator

Lateness to class. A student who is late to class may be permitted to enter the class but the late arrival may count as an absence after a certain period.

Removal from class. If a student is required to leave a class for misbehaviour or another breach of the College Code of Conduct, this will be recorded as an absence from class. If students are asked to leave they must go to the front office immediately and will be placed into a senior class. A Reconnect meeting will take place after school in the Library with the Student sent out and the teacher who exited them from class.

Students may be sent home from school to change if the correct uniform is not worn. This will count as an absence.

Attendance can be monitored on compass by

- Log on to compass
- Click on Profile (attendance, schedule, Reports)
- Attendance Tab
- Summary Tab (Outlines daily attendance summaries)

When a student fails to meet attendance requirements over a number of subjects they will be required to appear before a Panel to review the situation.

Proposed Satisfactory Completion Policy

Year 10


- If 50% or above is achieved, for school based assessment tasks the teacher awards the original percentage score
- If a student achieves below 50% they are supported through the redemption process to demonstrate the outcome under the same assessment conditions. The original numerical score is awarded.
- If a student does not achieve 50% on the redemption task, the teacher awards an At Risk for the assessment category, completes the Student at Risk section of the Satisfactory Completion Policy Form and submits this form to the Coordinator.
- Further action will involve the student to demonstrate the outcome.
- The awarding of satisfactory completion for Subjects is based on a decision that the student has demonstrated achievement of the set of CATS specified for the Subject. This decision will be based on the teacher's assessment of the student's overall performance on assessment tasks designated for the Subject.

Redemption will be used by teachers for students to catch up on missed work.

Shops in Buckley Street

The shops opposite the school in Buckley Street are not to be used during the normal school day. Breaches will be dealt with by Campus Coordinator and may result in suspension. You are not to go to the shops during Recess or Lunchtime, you may before school or after school.


